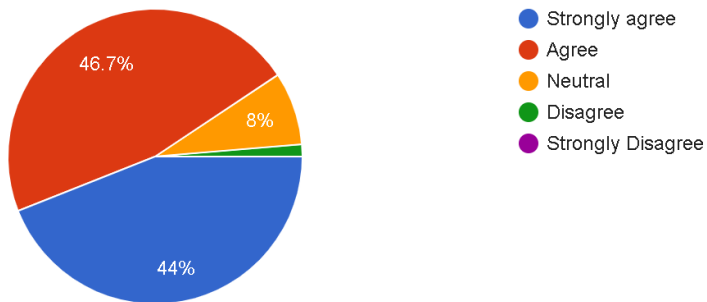

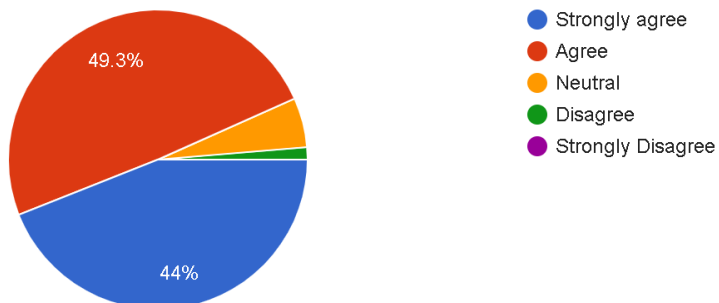
My child is happy at this school.

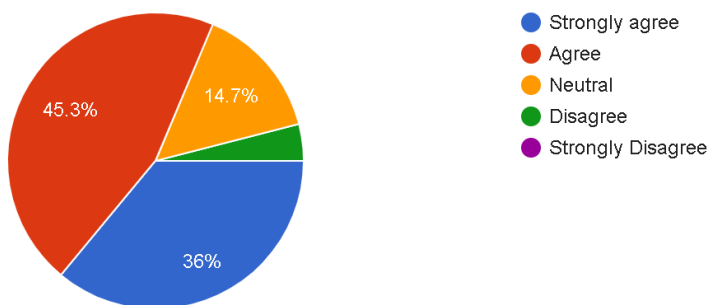
My child feels safe at this school.

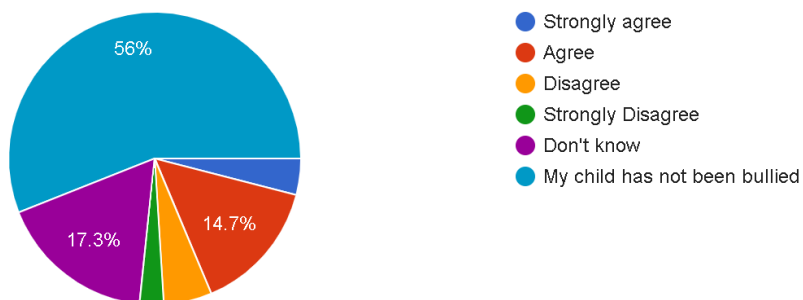
This school makes sure pupils are well behaved.

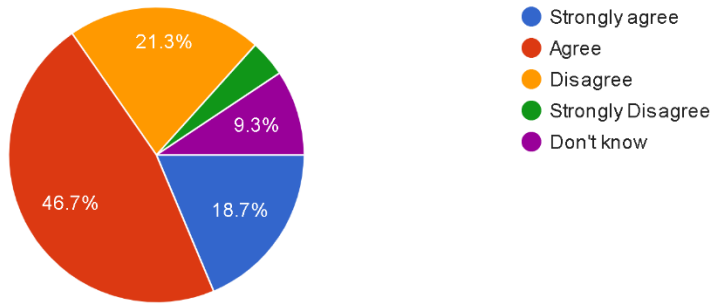
My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.

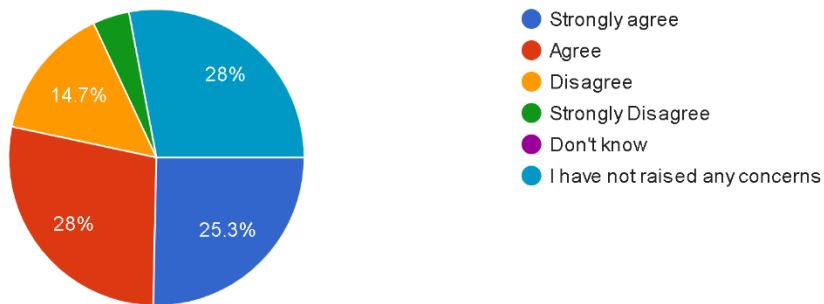

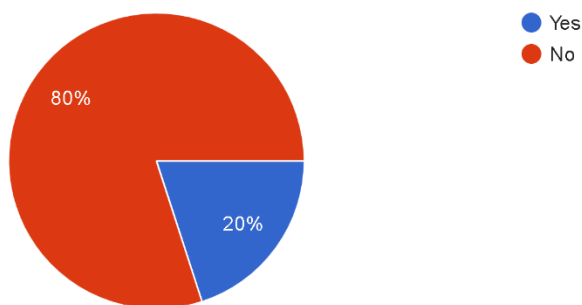
When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.

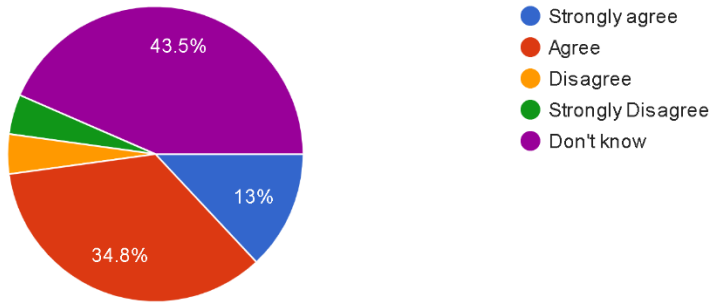
Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND)?

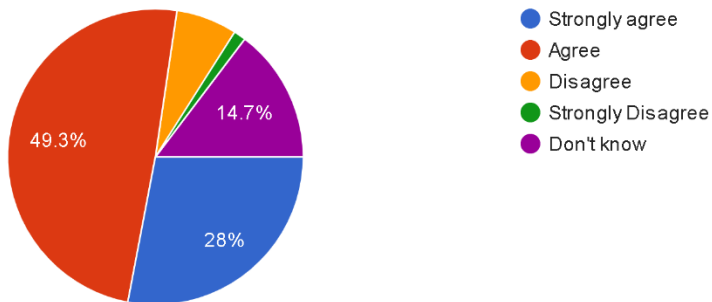

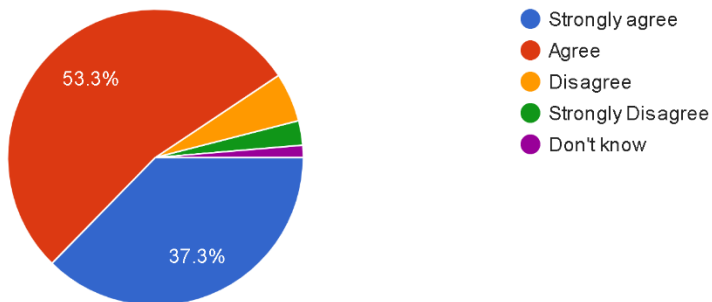

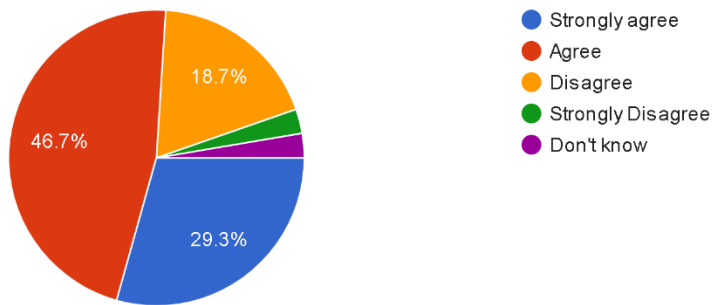
My child does well at this school.

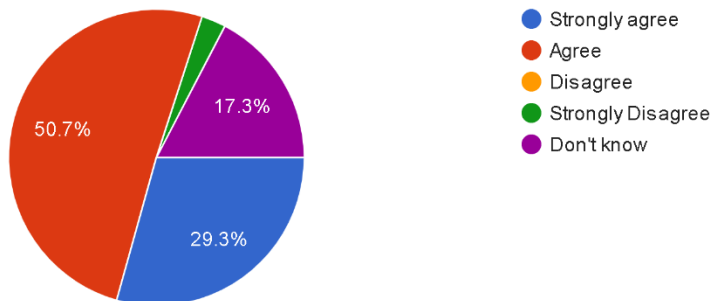

All schools report to parents 3 times yearly. There are parents' evenings in the Autumn and the Spring, (this year they were held via zoom) and an end of year school report which goes out in July. We do contact parents inbetween these times if there are any concerns around behaviour or learning. We aware that some of our Nursery parents may have expected a daily update as they would have had in a private Nursery setting, this isn't possible in a mainstream school. Our Nursery and Reception Parents have also not had the "stay and play" sessions with their children that they would have, had their not been a pandemic.

There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.

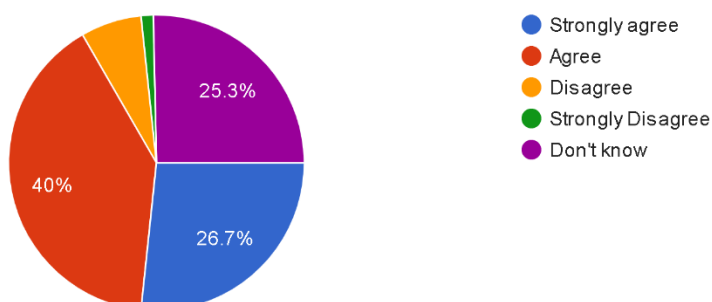

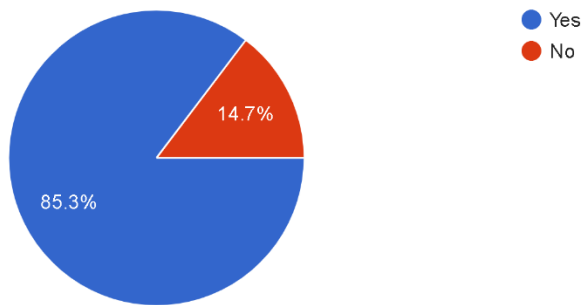
The school supports my child's wider personal development.

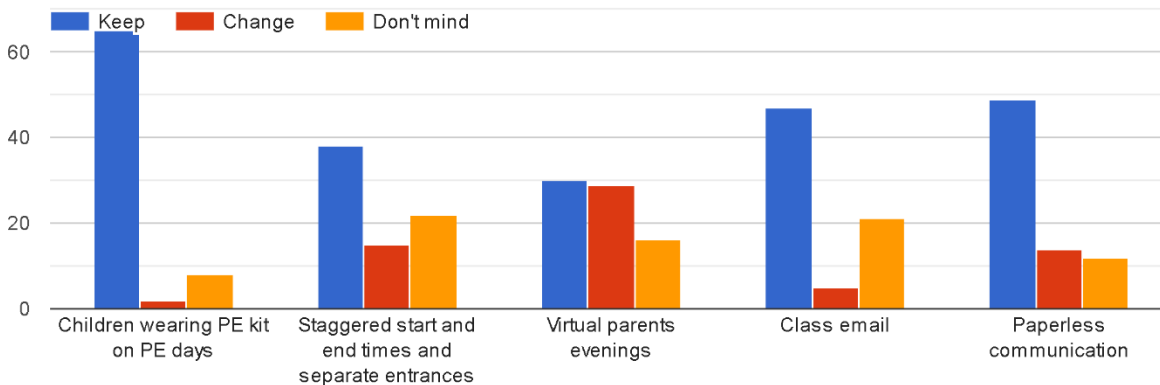

Year 6 should be able to go back home on their own like previous years and other schools.

I feel school dinners are not healthy and not a great variety, it's carbohydrate foods everyday. There has been no vegetables offered on any dinner serving.

I also feel children's outdoor facilities are dangerous and more could be done with the playing areas

Letters will be going to Y6 parents this week with regards to the children walking home for the rest of this term.

As our covid restrictions are in place, the children are still eating in the classrooms so unfortunately there is a limited menu. The children do receive fruit everyday and the sauce on the pasta is full of vegetables. Hopefully in September we will go back to our usual school meal provision.

The Early Years playground (where parents pick up for Y1,2 and EYFS) is going to be redeveloped over the summer holiday, you will see a dramatic difference in September. The other

outdoor facilities ie the KS2 yard, the trim trail and the astro turf are safe. Whilst there isn't a wide range of play equipment on the KS2 yard, the priority is the EYFS area for safety reasons.

For all schools to become more involved in the local area and connect with community groups and services who provide activities for families of the school. Not just those nationally promoted, but those tailored to local families.

This will form a better understanding of ways in which our children can be supported both inside and outside of school.

The school to have presence in wider community events.

Ie, litterpicks - Blackley Litter Pickers or maybe organise a school litterpick.

Also promote local jobs in the school news letter and local activities for the weekend etc

This would really help us as families feel more connected just as we do during the summer fairs etc

Due to the pandemic we have been unable to be involved in any wider community events this year, or host any ourselves.

Local events are highlighted on the newsletter/Twitter feed as and when we are informed about them (this doesn't seem to happen very often).

We had planned to host a summer fayre when restrictions were lifted, but as we are still in covid measures this hasn't been able to take place.

Unfortunately, due to covid we can't offer any afterschool clubs other than covid catchup or afterschool care for working families.

Re being more proactive in communication – We are open to suggestions about this as. We communicate with the community weekly via the newsletter and as and when required via email and school spider. Any suggestions on how we can improve this would be welcomed.

If you say you will help a child with extra work in areas they are struggling, try to actually set work for at home to help them. Setting work online is not always an ideal option and feel a paper alternative should be offered.
