
Here are some news items for this week:

Ukraine – We have offered prayers this week for people from Ukraine. We will be organising some fundraising to support those affected by the war in the week or so.

World Book Day – We are celebrating this tomorrow (Friday 4th March). Children may wear costumes related to their favourite books or their pyjamas and their favourite bedtime story. We've also asked classes to make a book in a box and some of these have come in to school already – they look great. Also we would like you to get crafty and create a story in a box! All you need is a shoe box or cardboard box. Cut the front off the box and create a 3D scene from your favourite story using whatever you like!







Moki Bands – We are re-introducing Moki bands as a wellbeing initiative for the children from Y2-Y6. These are pedometers which the children will wear at school. (No uniforms, workwear, pillows, duvets or pieces of fabric please)




