Dear Parents and Carers

Another newsletter at short notice but some important information and reminders to share:

Hometime – When we returned to school following Covid, we brought in the system of all siblings in a family being picked up from one door, this was to reduce adult contact as they went from one pick up door to another. From tonight, Tuesday 10th May we are going to revert to our pre-Covid pickup arrangements. **I.e. please collect each child from the door allocated to their class.**

We realise that for some parents this will mean going from one door to another, as you have done in the past. This decision has been taken due to a safeguarding concern regarding the large number of children being dismissed from the EYFS classroom doors. Thank you for your cooperation with this change which will help to keep all our children safe at home time.

Uniform – Please be reminded once again of our uniform policy. In particular:

Earrings – Must be a small plain stud, removed for PE. We are seeing various shapes, hearts, horseshoes, words, gemstones and larger sizes, which are more likely to be caught on something – Children will be asked to remove these.

Hair – Braids must be natural colours only. Hair accessories should be black or red with bows no bigger than 5cm (save your fancy hair things for own clothes day).

Shoes – Black shoes only. No boots or trainers, or any footwear with a sports logo. (Please note, some children do wear trainers or boots due to diagnosed medical needs).
