

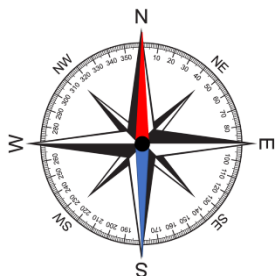
# Knowledge Organiser – Study counties and regions of the United Kingdom

Key Knowledge
- Know a compass is used to find direction, with four cardinal points: North, South, East, and West.
- Know intercardinal points are in between: Northeast, Southeast, Northwest, and Southwest.
- Know cities are larger than towns and have features like airports and banks.
- Know counties are areas with local governments, such as Greater Manchester and Cheshire.
- Know England, Scotland Wales and Northern Ireland have physical landmarks and human landmarks.
- Know topography describes features using map symbols; large- and small-scale maps show details or regions.
