Key Knowledge

Rivers have three parts: upper course (v-shaped valleys, pebbles), middle course (wider, meanders, sand), and lower course (floodplains, slow flow, mud).

Key terms: freshwater (not salty), channel (river path), tributary (smaller stream joining), confluence (meeting point).

River Nile: the longest river, flowing through Africa from the White and Blue Nile sources.
